1. PERFORMANCE

1.1 They discussed current performance issues. The Deputy Mayor asked that performance data presented always include the seven key crime targets identified by MOPAC.

2. FINANCE

2.1 They noted that the Home Secretary has announced that there will be no further reductions in the 2013/14 policing budget, although the Autumn Statement outlines further funding reductions from 2014 onwards (2% in 2014/15). The Mayor is now considering the implications of this.

2.2 They noted the announcement of the Government's new approach to Public Private Partnerships, PF2, and intend to consider the potential benefits of this model in due course.

3. UPDATE ON ACTIVITIES AND PROJECTS

3.1 Local Policing Model. consultation on the Police and Crime Plan will soon begin. They discussed the drafting of the plan..

3.2 Police contact points. They discussed public access in the light of the Local Policing Model.

6.4 Technology. The Deputy Mayor stated that new crime-fighting products and apps were being developed apace and urged the MPS to be alert to technological advances which might be of use.

6.5 Police Arbitration Tribunal (PAT). They noted that earlier in the week the PAT had made recommendations to the Home Secretary following the review of police pay and conditions carried out by Tom Winsor. .
